To our MCs and our artists, those programmed and our blackboard performers - some being on stage for the first time - thanks for helping make Wintermoon the memorable event it is.

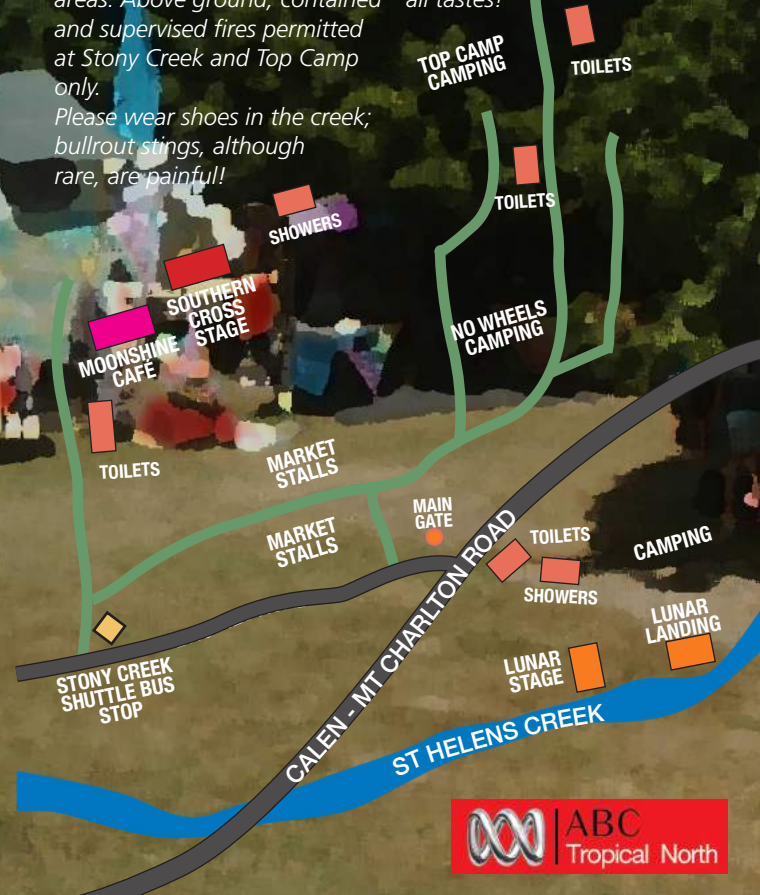
